

"Aluminum is becoming more and more popular in creative art circles," Kellett explains, "It is being used in sculpture where artists cast, weld, cut, and manipulate the parts. Morn pointers use it as a base for all pointing, acrylic pointing and alkyd pointing. Very rarely has aluminum been used as a medium to create a pointing, Possibly, this is due to the fact that an onaditing is normally used for decorative and profective coatings, and most artists do not have an anodizing in facility to make such pointings."

Kellett finds inspiration in the Silicon Valley and the hi-tech environment in which he lives. After developing many of the anodizing techniques, he worked and studied for five years have the Humphrey, who with Kellett's assistance turned the medium into an art form using his own artistic expression.
